

Moore prepares to be president

The next president of the McMinnville Breakfast Rotary Club, Ryan J. Moore, joined 449 fellow Rotary leaders in Nashville to fine tune their skills to lead their clubs next year.

A local attorney, Moore has been a Rotarian for more than four years. He will assume responsibilities as Breakfast Rotary president June 24.

President-elects from Tennessee, Kentucky, and Alabama were in attendance March 20-23. McMinnville Breakfast Rotary Club has served the people of McMinnville since it was chartered in 1985.

Under Moore's term as president, Breakfast Rotary plans to donate a new van to Kids of the Community, a 501(c)3 organization dedicated to at-risk children in the community. In addition, the club plans to participate in most of the 200 organized activities sponsored by Kids of the Community by giving

service hours.
